# **Sincerity**

In our society, people use many different things as their guide in religion. Some rely on the thoughts and assertions made by their local preacher. Others rely on a manmade ruling body to be their guide in matters of faith. Others rely on some form of creed book to tell them what they are to believe. Still some rely on their feelings and emotions to navigate their way through religious matters. Unfortunately all of these guides or standards fall short in comparison to the only true standard of religion – the Bible (2 Timothy 3:16-17).

To such a statement many shout in contempt, "I know I am right because I feel it in my heart!" It is true that religion must be heart-felt, but is it enough to feel it in my heart; in other words, is it enough to be sincere, or does that sincerity have to be coupled with Bible truth? We seek to answer such a question in the following discussion.

Most all have studied the account of Joseph; the favoritism that was shown to him by his father Jacob, the jealously that formed towards Joseph by his brothers, the selling into slavery of Joseph at age 17, and the false report that was delivered to Jacob. "So they took Joseph's tunic, killed a kid of the goats, and dipped the tunic in the blood. Then they sent the tunic of many colors, and they brought it to their father and said, "We have found this. Do you know whether it is your son's tunic or not?" And he recognized it and said, "It is my son's tunic. A wild beast has devoured him. Without doubt Joseph is torn to pieces." Then Jacob tore his clothes, put sackcloth on his waist, and mourned for his son many days. And all his sons and all his daughters arose to comfort him; but he refused to be comforted, and he said, "For I shall go down into the grave to my son in mourning." Thus his father wept for him" (Genesis 37:31-35). Was Jacob sincere in his belief that his son was dead? Most definitely, the sorrow he exhibited is proof. But did his sincerity mean that his belief was correct? No, it did not because his belief was not based on the truth. Many today are very sincere in their religious beliefs, but if those religious beliefs are not based on Truth (the Bible) then those beliefs are inaccurate no matter how sincere they may be.

It is possible for one today to be sincere in his religious practices, but he may be sincerely wrong. It is my hope and prayer that each of us will check our practices and teachings in religious matters against the infallible Word of God; may we each give a "Thus says God" for all that we do.
