The Three S's of the Gospel

Part 1

“For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ, for it is the power of God to salvation for everyone who believes, for the Jew first and also for the Greek” (Romans 1:16). The Gospel of Christ is the good news of the means of salvation by the sacrifice of Jesus. There are many ways to look at this good news. I have heard, as I am sure you have as well, very scholarly sermons on this beautiful subject, but I believe the power of the Gospel is found in its simplicity. With that in mind, I want us to begin this morning by taking a very simple approach. I want us to notice the three s's of the Gospel.

The story of the Gospel goes all the way back to the beginning of man in Genesis. “Then God said, "Let Us make man in Our image, according to Our likeness; let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over the cattle, over all the earth and over every creeping thing that creeps on the earth." So God created man in His own image; in the image of God He created him; male and female He created them” (Genesis 1:26-27).

After the creation of man, God placed them in the Garden of Eden. The man and woman were to tend and keep the garden. Also they could eat of any tree in the garden except the one in the middle of the garden (Genesis 2:15-17).

Unfortunately the first man and woman did not obey the commandment that God had given them. “So when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, that it was pleasant to the eyes, and a tree desirable to make one wise, she took of its fruit and ate. She also gave to her husband with her, and he ate” (Genesis 3:6).

And because of that act, we have our first “s” which we will begin to notice next week.
