Was Our Gospel Meeting a Success?

A good question to ask at the conclusion of any endeavor is, “Was this endeavor successful?” Now that our Gospel Meeting has ended, we want to ask and answer that question today. As we ask this question though, let us measure our standard for success with God’s ruler and not the world’s. There are three criteria that need to be met before we can decide if we had an effective Gospel Meeting.

First, was the Gospel preached during this meeting? It is the Gospel that has the power to save (Rom. 1:16). It is God’s Word that is living and powerful (Heb 4:12). It was through the breath of God that man became alive physically (Gen. 2:7), and it is only through the God-breathed words of the Bible (2 Tim. 3:16) that man can be made alive spiritually. Was the Gospel preached during this meeting? Did David Powell deliver messages from God’s Word? The answer to that question is a resounding yes, and so our first criteria has been met.

Second, were men and women invited to come hear that Gospel message? It is not enough to simply preach the right message, we must make every attempt to invite people to hear that message. In Mark 16:15-16, Jesus said, “Go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature. He who believes and is baptized will be saved; but he who does not believe will be condemned.” Notice that according to Jesus, it is our obligation to go to the lost, but it is not our obligation to make them believe. During this meeting many attempts were made to invite people. Facebook and mailed flyers were utilized to further the knowledge of the meeting. Flyers were distributed by several who went to the Tomato Festival. Also, numerous personal invitations were made by members. Obviously we can always do more, and we should strive to invite people to every service not just those during a Gospel Meeting. At the same time though, it is obvious that many attempts were made to meet our second criteria.

Third, were members of the Lord’s church strengthened and encouraged by attending the services? While the primary purpose of a Gospel Meeting is to reach the lost, it is also a time for the local membership to receive strength and encouragement. Jesus told Peter that he was to strengthen the brethren (Luke 22:32), and we all need to strengthen one another. Everyone who made this meeting a priority, attended the services, and applied what was taught was strengthened and encouraged. So our third and final criteria was met.

Without a doubt, in the eyes of God, our meeting was successful because all three criteria were met! But the work is not done. Let’s continue to reach out to the lost and encourage one another as we take the Gospel message to the world.
