"Come Worship with Us!"

Last week we continued a study of the eternal home of the faithful Christian, Heaven. We stated that Heaven is a real place and noticed the scriptural evidence for that statement. Now we want to notice two more characteristics of this wonderful place called Heaven.

Second, Heaven is a rewarding place. "Blessed are you when they revile and persecute you, and say all kinds of evil against you falsely for My sake. Rejoice and be exceedingly glad, for great is your reward in heaven, for so they persecuted the prophets who were before you" (Matthew 5:11-12). In Romans 6:23 we so often focus on the first half of the verse, "The wages of sin is death," but what about the other part? "The gift of God is eternal life in Jesus Christ our Lord." Paul described it as a crown of righteousness. "For I am already being poured out as a drink offering, and the time of my departure is at hand. I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith. Finally, there is laid up for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous Judge, will give to me on that Day, and not to me only but also to all who have loved His appearing" (2 Timothy 4:6-8). The reward is dependent on the life lived, and the life lived is influenced by the reward. There is a strong connection between the two. Heaven is a reward for a life lived in faithfulness to God.

Third, Heaven is a *resting* place. "Then I heard a voice from heaven saying to me, 'Write: 'Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord from now on.'' 'Yes,' says the Spirit, 'that they may rest from their labors, and their works follow them'" (Revelation 14:13). Living the Christian life is not always easy. In fact, it can be difficult sometimes. That is why I am thankful for a place of rest from the trials and tribulations of this world. "And God will wipe away every tear from their eyes; there shall be no more death, nor sorrow, nor crying. There shall be no more pain, for the former things have passed away" (Revelation 21:4). That one verse tells me all that I need to know about Heaven to make me want to go there. Heaven is a place of rest.
