Red and Yellow, Black and White

We are studying a problem that goes by many names: favoritism, prejudice, racism, sexism, discrimination. We noted that as Christians this should be an attitude that we avoid and detest. There are three reasons why we as Christians reject all forms of discrimination. First, discrimination is not in keeping with the character of God. Let's notice the second one.

Second, discrimination is not in keeping with the reason that **Christ was crucified.** Was Christ sacrificed on the cross for males only? Was He killed for whites only? Was He crucified for the rich and affluent only? We know the answer to those questions! Christ gave His life for all!

"For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life" (John 3:16). God sent his son for the "world" according to John. That includes red and yellow, black and white. The exclusion of a person from the benefits of the cross based simply upon the color of that person's skin is an insult to the Christ who gave His life on that cross.

In 1 John 4, John talks about Christ's sacrifice and the need to love our fellow man. "We love Him because He first loved us. If someone says, "I love God," and hates his brother, he is a liar; for he who does not love his brother whom he has seen, how can he love God whom he has not seen? And this commandment we have from Him: that he who loves God must love his brother also" (1 John 4:19-21). John makes it clear that we can't love God, who sent His Son for the world, and hate our fellow man. Having discrimination in our hearts is not in keeping with the crucifixion of Christ.

Next week we will notice the final reason why the Christian should reject any form of discrimination: God's command.
