Red and Yellow, Black and White

We are studying a problem that goes by many names: favoritism, prejudice, racism, sexism, discrimination. We noted that as Christians this should be an attitude that we avoid and detest. There are three reasons why we as Christians reject all forms of discrimination. First, discrimination is not in keeping with the character of God. Second, discrimination is not in keeping with the reason that Christ was crucified. Let's notice the final one.

Third, discrimination is not in keeping with the commands of God. James, writing by the inspiration of God, condemned showing favor to only a certain group of people. "My brethren, do not hold the faith of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Lord of glory, with partiality" (James 2:1). James said not to hold the faith of Christ, i.e. the Gospel of Christ, with partiality. Friends, that statement is a command not a suggestion. We sing a song sometimes, "The Gospel is For All." Are we just singing the words, or do we truly believe what we are saying?

"For if there should come into your assembly a man with gold rings, in fine apparel, and there should also come in a poor man in filthy clothes, and you pay attention to the one wearing the fine clothes and say to him, "You sit here in a good place," and say to the poor man, "You stand there," or, "Sit here at my footstool," have you not shown partiality among yourselves, and become judges with evil thoughts?" (James 2:2-4). The people were judging based solely on the outward appearance and James said that these thoughts are "evil thoughts!"

"But if you show partiality, you commit sin..." (James 2:9). James then states very plainly what you are doing when you show discrimination – you sin. If we are going to be faithful Christians, then we cannot show partiality because such is sinful. Discrimination is not in keeping with the commandments of God.

"Jesus loves the little children, all the children of the world. Red and yellow, black and white, they are precious in His sight. Jesus loves the little children of the world." Let's live our lives in such a way that we declare those words every day. Let's follow the words of our Savior, "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature. He who believes and is baptized will be saved; but he who does not believe will be condemned" (Mark 16:15-16). May God bless us as we do His will without partiality in our hearts and our actions.
