"Come Worship with Us!"

Out with the Old and In with the New

For the most part, we all like new things. Whether it is a new car, house, or computer, we like new things. Why is that? The reason is that many times the old version has problems that the new one does not have. It would be great to be able to say, "Out with the old and in with the new!"

In 2 Corinthians 5:1-9, Paul in essence says exactly that. He speaks of an old body with its imperfections and a new body which is perfect that we will receive when Jesus returns. "For we know that if our earthly house, this tent, is destroyed, we have a building from God, a house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens. For in this we groan, earnestly desiring to be clothed with our habitation which is from heaven, if indeed, having been clothed, we shall not be found naked. For we who are in this tent groan, being burdened, not because we want to be unclothed, but further clothed, that mortality may be swallowed up by life. Now He who has prepared us for this very thing is God, who also has given us the Spirit as a guarantee. So we are always confident, knowing that while we are at home in the body we are absent from the Lord. For we walk by faith, not by sight. We are confident, yes, well pleased rather to be absent from the body and to be present with the Lord. Therefore we make it our aim, whether present or absent, to be well pleasing to Him" (2 Corinthians 5:1-9). We want to notice three statements made by Paul.

Paul begins by saying, "Out with the old!" Paul gives us a fourfold description of the earthly body and its imperfections. First, Paul refers to this body as an earthly tabernacle or tent. The Tabernacle was not a permanent structure. Paul is telling us that our bodies are temporary structures. Second, he describes our bodies as being filled with groans and sighs. This earthly body is filled with problems. A short visit to the hospital bears that point out quite well. Third, Paul refers to the dying nature of this body. The word "dissolve" carries with it the idea of taking down a tent. This body is not eternal. Every day we live, we are one day closer to the day of our death. Finally, Paul refers to this earthly body's inability to be with Jesus. In order to be with Jesus, we must cast off this old body with its imperfection. We are absent from the Lord in the physical sense.

Next week, we will notice what else Paul has to say concerning the statement, "Out with the old and in with the new." ~ Justin
